Committee Role Profile

OFFICIATING LEAD

Introduction

The following role profile is not intended to be comprehensive, nor is it an expectation that potential volunteers will possess all the skills/personal qualities listed. However, the Officiating Lead will have sound knowledge of the management committee.

The role of the Oxfordshire Development Board Officiating Lead is held by the elected official for two years.

This role profile should be read in conjunction with the Oxfordshire Netball Management Committee – Roles, Skills and Personal Qualities document which outlines the requirements of all ONBD officers.

The Officiating Lead role is to:

- Report to the Chairperson
- Be responsible for providing management, leadership and taking a strategic overview of officiating.
- Be responsible for improving the standards of officiating within Oxfordshire Netball by providing opportunity for the continuous updating of knowledge and skill.
- Identify and drive the training, development of mentors, assessors, umpires and table officials for Oxfordshire Netball.
- Allocate umpires for the ONJL & ONL league matches.
- Oversee the work of the Officiating coordinators.
- Liaise between EN, South Region, Registered Members League, subcommittees and the ONDB.
- Guide, coordinate and chair meetings of the Officiating subcommittee.
- Prepare a report of the year's activities for the AGM.
- Represent Oxfordshire Netball at the South Region TSG
- Champion the ONE Awards for Officiating.

Skills/Personal Qualities of the Officiating Lead:

A Officiating Lead is required to have good communication, interpersonal and leadership skills. This role will suit someone with initiative and drive who is able to work in partnership with others, is good at teambuilding and can delegate. This person will have sound knowledge of netball governance along with understanding of the roles/responsibilities of the ONDB.

An aspiring Officiating Lead will need to be willing to chair meetings and ensure that decisions are taken and followed up. They will need to be strong networker with knowledge of Oxfordshire Netball's key networks and be prepared to speak clearly and succinctly as the public face of Oxfordshire Netball.

The Officiating Lead will ideally be a B Award Umpire (or above) and have sound knowledge of the EN officiating pathway.
