## Committee Role Profile

### COMPETITIONS LEAD

#### Introduction

The following role profile is not intended to be comprehensive, nor is it an expectation that potential volunteers will possess all the skills/personal qualities listed. However, the Competitions Lead will have sound knowledge of the management committee.

The role of the Oxfordshire Development Board Competitions Lead is held by the elected official for two years.

This role profile should be read in conjunction with the Oxfordshire Netball Management Committee – Roles, Skills and Personal Qualities document which outlines the requirements of all ONBD officers.

#### The Competitions Lead role is to:

- Report to the Chairperson
- Be responsible for the smooth running of the ONJL & ONL leagues.
- Guide, coordinate and chair meetings of the Competitions subcommittee.
- Oversee the work of the Fixtures & Results secretaries for the ONJL & ONL League ensuring the accuracy of the fixtures and results on the current system (League Republica).
- Liaise with the Officiating Lead to ensure the umpires are allocated to the league games.
- Be responsible for the annual tournament and events as instructed by the ONDB.
- Prepare a report on the year's activities for the AGM.

#### Skills/Personal Qualities of the Competitions Lead:

A Competition Lead is required to have good communication, interpersonal and leadership skills. This role will suit someone with initiative and drive who is able to work in partnership with others, is good at teambuilding and can delegate. This person will have sound knowledge of netball governance along with understanding of the roles/responsibilities of the ONDB.

An aspiring Competitions Lead will need to be willing to chair meetings and ensure that decisions are taken and followed up. They will need to be strong networker with knowledge of Oxfordshire Netball's key networks and be prepared to speak clearly and succinctly as the public face of Oxfordshire Netball.

The Competitions Lead will ideally possess excellent organizational skills and be able to remain clam under pressure.
